INTERGREEN is an initiative aimed at **promoting sustainability and green skills** within municipalities across six countries (Portugal, Italy, France, Greece, Cyprus, and North Macedonia). It is co-funded by the European Union under the **Erasmus+ program** and coordinated by GIP FIPAN, alongside ECO LOGIC, CIAPE, Synthesis, DIAS VET, and the Municipality of Lousada.



# INTERNATIONAL ONLINE MEETINGS



The **INTERGREEN** consortium organized two international online meetings in October and November 2024, bringing together **over 50 participants** from the six partner European countries.

The goal of the first meeting was to present the project's objectives and facilitate connections between representatives of the participating municipalities by sharing **the main environmental challenges** faced in their territories and the proposed solutions. During the second meeting, the games developed by the project consortium were introduced: the **board game Green UP** and the **digital game**. A gaming session was then organized in each country to provide a practical demonstration of these tools.



The highlight of these exchanges was the opportunity for municipalities from different countries to meet and **share common environmental challenges**, particularly regarding water management.



# TRAINING WORKSHOPS



Between **October and November 2024**, the INTERGREEN project consortium organized training workshops in the participating countries. In France, these workshops, organized by GIP FIPAN in partnership with the association *neede*, brought together **9 municipal representatives** from La Farlède, Draguignan, Gignac-la-Nerthe, Solliès-Toucas, Ollioules, and Vitrolles.

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During these workshops, the **four modules of the training program** developed as part of the project were presented to the participants. They were trained in sustainable development skills and green competencies, with a particular focus on the Sustainable Development Goals, municipal environment, and the case study methodology.



The participating municipal representatives also benefited from **presentations by experts**, who shared their experiences and concrete examples of projects, particularly in local communities, focusing on sustainable development and, more specifically, the regeneration of water systems through urban planning.
